## Antarctic AND Zero Carbon



**6pm Thursday 14 March 2019 Northumbria University**

*The Challenges on Energy in the Antarctic are manifold but the Princess Elisabeth Research Station is attempting to do that with zero environmental impact. The Station was designed to be Antarctica's first zero-emission base. It's planned as a 'passive building,' with all the materials maximising energy use and heat distribution. Melting snow produces a renewable water supply for drinking and cooking, and used water is purified and re-used for the showers, toilets and washing machine.*
